A Recipe for Health Whole Grain Chicken Pot Pie

Ingredients

Prep time

45 min

nonstick cooking spray	1
whole wheat flour	2 cup
baking powder	4 tsp
cold margarine (trans-fat-free)	4 tbsp
parsley (dried)	1 tbsp
skim milk	1 cup
olive oil	1 tsp
carrot(s) (diced)	2
celery stalks (diced)	2


Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Coat a 9x13-inch baking dish with cooking spray and set aside.
- **2.** In a large bowl, sift together the whole wheat flour and baking powder. Cut in the margarine and then add the parsley and milk, and gently stir to combine. Refrigerate until needed.
- **3.** Add the olive oil and a generous amount of cooking spray to a large nonstick sauté pan over medium-high heat. Add the carrots, celery, onion and mushrooms. Sauté for 10 minutes or until the vegetables are soft but not mushy.
- 4. Stir in the cooked chicken.
- 5. In a small bowl, whisk together the flour, skim milk, salt and ground black pepper. Add to the vegetable mixture and bring to a boil. Reduce to a simmer for 2 minutes. Remove from heat.
- 6. Pour the chicken and vegetable mixture into the baking dish. Drop clumps of the whole wheat crust mixture on top of the chicken and vegetable mixture (the topping will be very sticky). Use a spoon to gently spread the topping.
- 7. Bake for 20 minutes and serve.

2023 Environmental Recap

With 2023 coming to an end, I felt it was a good time to let everyone know what we accomplished throughout the year.

I will start with an exciting project that SRI is working with UW Oshkosh to de-pollute our "oily" water in our containment structures. Currently we have an outside environmental service pump out our water on a weekly and even sometimes daily basis, dependent on the weather. They then transport the liquids to their facility & we pay a per gallon fee for the treatment of the water to be discharged into a municipal wastewater treatment plant. With the help of the University, we are exploring the possibility of depolluting the water onsite to reduce the cost of handling these liquids. The students, led by Professor Marcel Dijkstra, MBA, PhD. have been modeling treatment options to remove the pollutants to a level that it can be discharged into the sanitary sewer for final cleaning. They have completed one model so far and are working on a second model to further reduce 2 more pollutants that were a bit high after going through the first model. Hopefully this joint effort will be successful and reduce costs for depolluting and still taking care of our environment.

The second environmental success in the Sadoff world was we had a WDNR audit of our Green Bay facility. The WDNR official onsite was very impressed with our storm water controls and the measures taken at the outfalls where the water leaves the yard. Sadoff passed with a 100% compliance rating and the official stated that she had been to many scrap facilities in her days and the Sadoff facilities always impress her. Way to go Team Green Bay!!

Some other highlights throughout the year were:

- Clean up & disposal of multiple debris piles in FDL, Lincoln & Sheboygan. This allows us to stay compliant with our Storm Water Permit.
- New concrete Cap in Sheboygan covering the old fuel tank area. This is a continuing obligation.
- Multiple properties with decrepit buildings acquired, demolished, and cleaned up.

Directions

- 1. In a medium skillet over medium heat, toast the almond flour for 3 minutes or until golden, stirring often to avoid burning.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix the toasted almond flour, 1 1/2 tbsp of the erythritol, cinnamon and salt. Add the espresso and stir. Divide between 6 serving glasses (about 1 heaping tablespoon each).
- **3.** In a medium bowl, mix the yogurt with the mascarpone, remaining 1/4 cup erythritol, rum, orange zest and vanilla. Spoon about 1/3 cup on top of the coffee-almond base in each of the serving glasses. Dust each tiramisu lightly with cocoa powder just before serving.









Trailer Support Stand

The ancient Greek philosopher Plato once wrote "our need will be the real creator" or as we would better know it today "necessity is the mother of invention". This couldn't be truer in the scrap business. Sadoff Iron and Metal Company is very good at seeing a problem and developing a solution within our own shops. This fall, Steve Henry, Wesley Howe and myself collaborated on such a project. A recent example is damage that we have been incurring to our trailers at a particular account due to the material and the way its loaded. The large bundles of tubing are dumped over the sides of our trailer with enough force to cause damage to the landing gear and frame of the trailer. While we cannot change or control the loading of the material the next best way to preserve our equipment is to better distribute the stresses from the loading process. Enter the birth of a custom-built stand designed to absorb that stress. Wesley is our youth apprentice from Fond du Lac High School. He took a handwritten sketch and ran with it, transforming raw steel and a couple used landing gear legs into a sturdy and mobile support device. Steve

and mobile support device. St provided his usual guidance and sage advice. The stand has been deployed for a couple months now and we are confident it will eliminate the trailer damage going forward. Kudos to Wes and Steve for bringing this idea to reality!
